### ~GIRL SCOUT GAZETTE~

Whew! This summer flew by! The girls of Troop #4161 love the summer, because they love being outside as much as they can! We had an amazing time on hikes, swimming, and camping! Our biggest adventure was caving in the Hendrie cave in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. It was an amazing experience that was filled with emotional and physical challenges (especially the day after for us sore adults!). Ms. Minda and Ms. Jenn even sat at the top of an underground waterfall, waist deep in water, so the girls could crawl on their hands and knees deep underground to get to us, where they could see the awesome things that our Pure Michigan has to offer, even in caves! The Hendrie cave is located on the Fiborn Karst Preserve that is owned by the Michigan Karst Conservancy. It was once the site of a limestone quarry from 1905 to 1936 which supplied high-calcium limestone to Algoma Steel in Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario. Henrie River Water Cave is the longest cave in Michigan at 1500 ft., and it is quite young (as far as caves go) carved in the past 7,000-10,000 years since the last glaciers in the area melted. Troop #4161 is grateful for the guidance and adventure from the members of the conservancy. A couple of the girls had never been to the U.P. before, and those two girls had a BEAR cross in front of their car! Between that, and the pouring rain out of nowhere, they had the full upper peninsula experience.

We also added a new member to our Troop. McKenzie brings our Troop to 10 girls. ALL ten girls also crossed over this summer to become Cadette Girl Scouts. So if you ever see them, they have now earned their tan (and final) vests! Congrats to all the girls on their hard work! As we move into this fall, many of the girls are hoping to begin the path of earning their Silver Awards, the second highest honor in Girl Scouting.
